Applications are invited for a **12-month term position in Health Studies at the Lecturer rank**, effective **July 1, 2017**. The candidate will be a part of an interdisciplinary Health Studies Program, housed in the Department of Psychology in the College of Arts and Science. Requirements for the position include a Ph.D. in Health Studies or a related discipline that will be completed by the time of appointment, along with evidence of teaching experience and effectiveness. Candidates with expertise in quantitative and/or qualitative research methods, indigenous health, health policy, development, or any other health related area will be considered.

The successful applicant will be expected to teach the undergraduate core courses of the program at both the junior and senior levels, including HISt 110 (Introduction to Health Studies), HISt 210 (Introduction to Quantitative and Qualitative Research Methods in Health Studies), HISt 310 (Theories and Applications in Health Studies), and HISt 410 (Honours Thesis in Health Studies).

The Psychology Department has 25 full-time faculty members, and 5 affiliate members from St. Thomas More College. There are over 75 graduate students completing an MA or PhD across the four graduate programs.

The College of Arts and Science offers a dynamic combination of programs in the sciences, social sciences, humanities, and fine arts. There are over 10,000 students in the College, and 295 faculty, including 12 Canada Research Chairs. The College emphasizes student and faculty research, interdisciplinary programs, community outreach and international opportunities. The successful candidate will have opportunities to collaborate with the Global Institute for Food Security, the Global Institute for Water Security, and other research centers that generate huge datasets and seek innovative ways to perform effective, large scale analysis.
