1 year Term Position in French**

The Department of Languages, Literatures and Cultural Studies of the University of Saskatchewan invites applications for a one-year limited term faculty position in French Studies at the rank of Lecturer (\$77,613 floor salary) effective July 1<sup>st</sup> 2017. This position comes with a comprehensive benefits package which includes pension plan, life insurance, sick leave, travel insurance, death benefit, dental plan, extended health and vision care plan, employee assistance program and flexible health and wellness spending program.

Successful candidates will have native or near-native proficiency in French and English and a demonstrated record of excellence in teaching French classes of various levels. A Ph.D. in French is preferred but ABD candidates will be considered. The ideal candidate will have a teaching and research focus on an area of Cultural Studies in French (film studies, critical theory, postcolonial literature, pop culture, media or technology etc.) or specialize in the Didactics of French as a Second Language. Experience and expertise in the use of computer-based language instructional will be considered an asset.

The candidate will teach courses of various levels of French language as well as senior courses in their area of specialization and will be expected to contribute to the administrative duties and to the research, scholarly, and artistic work activities of the department.

The Department comprises French, Spanish and German, and is housed in the College of Arts & Science which offers a dynamic combination of programs in the Humanities and Fine Arts, the Social Sciences and the Sciences and emphasizes student and faculty research, interdisciplinary programs, community outreach and international engagement.
