**Department of Linguistics and Religious Studies
1 Year Term in Islamic Studies**

The Department of Linguistics and Religious Studies, College of Arts and Science, University of Saskatchewan, invites applications for a one year full-time term appointment at the rank of Lecturer (floor salary of \$77,613) with primary specialization in the area of Islamic Studies commencing from 1 July, 2017. This position comes with a comprehensive benefits package which includes pension plan, life insurance (compulsory and voluntary), sick leave, travel insurance, death benefit, dental plan, extended health and vision care plan, employee assistance program and flexible health and wellness spending program.

The successful candidate should have a PhD in Islamic Studies, Religious Studies, Religion and Culture, or a closely related area. Demonstrated excellence in teaching will be preferred.

The responsibilities of the position include teaching 18 cu of RLST courses including Islamic civilization, religion and culture (RLST 112.3 Western Religions, RLST 113.3 Introduction to Islamic Civilization – 2 sections, RLST 240.3 Introduction to Islam, RLST 241.3 Islam in the Modern World, RLST 243 Islam in Hollywood, or any other courses as required by the program).
