**Department of Linguistics and Religious Studies
1 Year Term in Japanese**

The Department of Linguistics and Religious Studies, College of Arts and Science, University of Saskatchewan, invites applications for a one year term appointment at the rank of Lecturer (current base salary of \$77,613) with primary specialization in the area of Japanese language teaching, commencing on 1 July, 2017. This position comes with a comprehensive benefits package which includes pension plan, life insurance (compulsory and voluntary), sick leave, travel insurance, death benefit, dental plan, extended health and vision care plan, employee assistance program and flexible health and wellness spending program.

The position is subject to budgetary approval. The successful candidate should have significant graduate level training (minimally MA) in Japanese language teaching. Demonstrated excellence in teaching will be preferred.

The responsibilities of the position include teaching 18 cu, six three credit unit classes per academic year. Classes to be taught may include JPNS (Japanese) 113.3 Introductory Japanese I, JPNS 117.3 Introductory Japanese II, JPNS 233.3 Popular Culture and Cinema in Japan, and upper level classes in the area of the candidate's specialization or research interest.
