Professor Doug Chivers is a world-renowned researcher in the field of animal behavior, specializing in predator-prey chemosensory interactions. He has expanded his research to focus on understanding how prey animals, specifically fish and amphibians, perceive risk in their environment. This innovative work has led to several high-impact publications in prestigious journals and over 200 peer-reviewed papers and book chapters. Chivers held the Rawson Professorship, an honorary title bestowed by his colleagues, from 2010–13.
