DAVID L. KAPLAN CHAIR IN MUSIC – Strings (Orchestral Family)

The Department of Music at the University of Saskatchewan invites applications for the David L. Kaplan Chair in Music. This tenurable position, at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor, will support the performance, the research, scholarly and artistic work (RSAW), and the teaching activities of an accomplished performer, educator, and scholar in Strings (violin, viola, cello, or double bass). The position commences July 1, 2018.

The mandate of the David L. Kaplan Chair in Music is to develop and to maintain a strong string program that attracts undergraduate and graduate students to the Department of Music. The Kaplan Chair is expected to contribute to the Department of Music's commitments to: innovative teaching; RSAW; community outreach; and internationalization, which includes cultivating relationships with partner organizations in other countries (with a focus on China).

Qualifications for the position include: doctorate (preferred), but consideration will be given to those possessing a master of music degree plus extensive performance experience; a developed or an emerging international performance profile; substantial repertoire knowledge and interests; and a demonstrated commitment to excellence in studio teaching, ideally at a post-secondary level. The successful candidate will engage in studio performance instruction, as well as teaching and advising at the undergraduate and the graduate levels, and administrative functions commensurate with rank and type of appointment. Continuation of an active performance RSAW profile is essential. Additional duties—aligning with departmental needs and the successful candidate's area(s) of expertise—is likely to include some combination of: stewardship of the University of Saskatchewan's collection of Amati string instruments; chamber music coaching; ensemble leadership; classroom methods courses; novel instructional delivery; liaison work with the Saskatoon Symphony Orchestra, and with the string community of the province of Saskatchewan, and beyond. The ability to secure external funding is an asset.

With a present complement of nine full-time faculty members and fifteen sessional instructors, the Department of Music offers a B.Mus. (Performance, Individualized, and Music Education streams), a B.A. (Major in Music), as well as graduate degrees in close affiliation with three Colleges: Arts and Science, Education, and Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies. The Department of Music has an established record of national and international interdisciplinary activities including a number of performance and academic pursuits, and a variety of outreach and engagement activities.
