Fall Recap & POLS in the news



Period Poverty Project - USask Menstrual Equity Initiative

The Period Poverty Project is an initiative through the Deputy Pro-

vost's office set to have completed launching by the end of the academic calendar year. Menstrual equity is an issue that matters across the globe including our USask community members of students, staff, and faculty. The project aims to offer free menstrual hygiene products in 26 locations at USask with more than 60 washrooms (women's, men's, and gender-neutral facilities). As part of this effort, de-stigmatization of periods through resource materials will also be available. Access to these menstrual hygiene products will allow for a more fuller experience on campus for many while elevating financial burdens, and increasing the overall health and well-being of our USask community.

Democracy Under Threat?

A recent New York Times* article "<u>It Can Happen Here: 8 Great Books to Read About the Decline of</u> <u>Democracy</u>" outlined the growing trend of international democratic backsliding using examples such as upending elections and/or questioning electoral results, increasing support for populist and nationalist parties, and growing inequality. While US President Joe Biden recently announced a win for democracy after this month's US mid-term elections, the so-called "democratic recession" remains an international concern.

USask users must first register and create a personal account through the Library's subscription to the *New York Times in Education* program. Start <u>here</u> and search for *University of Saskatchewan*; click "create account" and complete fields: you must use a valid USASK email address. Finally verify your account through the email confirmation message. NOTE: individual registration may expire after one year but can be easily renewed.

Tip: If you don't have time to read the daily NYT in its entirety, subscribe to "<u>The Morning</u>" digest to get the day's top news stories delivered to your inbox.


