Eligible students must have completed 60 credit units, and have an average of 68%.

First Year Research Experience (FYRE)

Each of our 100 level courses in Political Studies has at least one First Year Research Experience section each term. A FYRE class asks students to go beyond studying a topic and move towards being a researcher. Students work with their instructor and a research coach through the research cycle:

Step one is defining a Research Question that is both appropriate to the course and 'doable' for a first year student

Step two is Investigating the research topic in order to answer that research question

Step three is Sharing the results of the research

FYRE classes set students up for future success, with 80% of students reporting increased confidence in conducting research. (<u>USask FYRE Web-site</u>)
