The Canadian Red Cross and the University of Saskatchewan, Department of Political Studies and the College of Law present the ONLINE 2022 International Humanitarian Law (IHL) academic conference: Armed Conflict & Protection of Future Generations. The Conference will begin with an introduction to IHL, linking the topic to the law of armed conflict and be followed by a panel. This event will bring together experts in the field, including academics and practitioners to discuss the challenges that this topic raises, including the impact of war on children, the environmental impact of conflict, and new weapons technologies and what lies ahead.

Join experts as they discuss contemporary challenges related to armed conflict as well as the role of International Humanitarian Law (IHL) in protecting future generations.



Political Studies Speaker Series



The Department of Political Studies is pleased to announce a Speaker Series Event with guest Dr. Sarah Munawar, PhD, on Friday, March 11, 2022 at 1:30pm via Zoom titled: *A Care-Based Epistemology of Islam*. Dr. Munawar is a Punjabi-Muslim and settler living on and sustained by the occupied and unceded lands and waters of the the Coast Salish peoples—Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish), Stó:lō and Səlílwəta?/Selilwitulh (Tsleil-Waututh) and xwməθkwəyəm (Musqueam) Nations.

She received her Ph.D in political science from the University of British Columbia and is also a political science instructor at Columbia College.

As a primary care-giver and mother, her research focuses on designing an intersectional and de-colonial ethic of care through Islamic thought that centres the epistemic authority of disabled Muslims and Muslim women as knowers of the "Islamic" and care-based modes of knowing Islam. Writing from the borderlands, she interrogates the limits of comparative political theory and the colonial

politics of recognition as paradigms for cross-cultural inquiry. Instead she offers political theorists, and Muslims, an Islamic-feminist and de-colonial epistemology that prioritizes body-sense, consent-based care, moral witnessing and collective accessibility in knowledge consumption and knowledge production.

Announcing the new USask Tutoring Network

The <u>USask Tutoring Network</u> is a recently launched platform focused on peer-to-peer help where students can find and <u>hire a Subject Tutor</u> for a specific course or in a subject area. An initiative of the University Library, in collaboration with USSU, this one-stop portal allows students to login using their secure campus NSID where they can review tutor profiles, arrange a session either online (via Zoom) or face-to-face, see upcoming sessions, and communicate with their tutor. Through the platform, students can also access and book appointments with the <u>Writing Help Centre</u> and <u>Math & Stats Centre</u> tutors as a free service offered by the University Library.
