Dr. Joe Garcea, August 1, 1956 - November 12, 2020

It was with great sadness that the Department of Political Studies bid farewell to Dr. Joe Garcea who passed away November 12, 2020 after a long battle with cancer. He will be greatly missed by students, coworkers and friends.

There was no limit to Joe's kindness, compassion or the way he truly cared about his fellow human beings. He devoted time to anyone who needed guidance or a friendly face, and always showed everyone that they mattered.

Professionally, Joe was a well-regarded political figure in Saskatchewan. He was highly sought after for comment or insight by journalists, he was enlisted by politicians to work on governmental projects and valued deeply within the community, often connecting students with mentors at local businesses and organizations. Prof. Garcea was a nationally recognized expert in Canadian Politics. He published on a wide range of themes central to the study of politics in Canada, including public administration, local government, and immigration and settlement policy. His work was animated by a commitment to the value of good government and sound public policy to the lives of Canadians and newcomers alike.

His thoughtfulness and humility lasted with his former students, as the general outpouring of love and condolences upon news of his death has shown.

The Global Studies Certificate Without the Global?

In a global pandemic, the world outside of our cities, province or country now seem even further away than normal. Well, let us be honest, anything outside of our living room can feel far away and 'remote' right now. This has created a lot of problems for our students and faculty in different ways both personal and academic. However, it poses a big dilemma for those seeking to attain the Global Studies Certificate (GSC).

The GSC is one of three certificates offered through the Department of Political Studies. It is an opportunity for students to demonstrate both an interest and competency in global affairs. As a certificate, it can be taken on its own without a degree. It can be taken in conjunction with any USask degree. Or it can be taken as an university alumni. There are over 300 courses that count towards the GSC from more than 10 colleges. This diversity creates an amazing cross disciplinary environment in the GSC core courses: IS110, IS201, IS202.

However, the pandemic has created a barrier to enrolling in IS202, the capstone course for the GSC. One prerequisite for enrollment is significant international experience. For example, a study abroad program, an international volunteer position, or being an international student would satisfy this requirement. But how are our students to get such experience during a global pandemic? One new initiative in the department may help. Dr Martin Gaal is working with Aditi Garg from Gwenna Moss and Chantal Hanson from ISSAC to adopt a COIL program in IS202 (Jan 2021) and IS201 (May 2021). COIL stands for Collaborative Online International Learning. In IS202, we will be piloting ISSAC material in partnership with Universidad de La Sabana in Columbia. In IS201, we will be building on this pilot project with Florida International University, USA.

In both cases, the COIL component will satisfy the 'international experience' requirement to enroll in IS202! So if you are interested in the GSC but the pandemic has kyboshed your international plans, contact the department for more information.


