



Tell us about your research?

I look at how environmental risk affects the reliance on chemical cues in tadpoles and more recently, cuttlefish in marine environments off the coast of France. I look at how cuttlefish react to ink produced by their neighbours, and how their prior experience with 'dangerous' environments affects their response to conspecific ink.

How did you get your position?

I first emailed my co-supervisors Drs. Maud Ferrari and Doug Chivers about possibly doing a Master's degree with them, and they helped me secure funding. The nice thing about their labs is that they don't expect you to have it all figured out when you arrive, instead they want you to come up with a project based on your own unique interests.

Any general tips for undergrads wanting to pursue future studies in biology?

Get started early! I remember emailing professors about their research and possible summer positions in the winter semester of my first year, so it is really never too early to get involved with research, and many professors can use volunteers even if they can't offer you a paid position. An early email and meeting with a professor whose work you are interested in is invaluable towards being hired with them in the future. I acquired many of my co-op positions in my undergrad by getting to know professors early on in my degree. Early experience in any lab can lead to more research opportunities and awards in the future, so build your research experience early on if you can!
