3. At least 12 cu must be at the 300 or 400 level. Math equivalents to ECON 305 and 306 **can** be used for to meet these requirements. Students contemplating applications to graduate schools are strongly advised to take Econ 404 (Econometrics), 411 (Monetary Theory), Econ 473 (Advanced Microeconomics), and additional courses in mathematics.
4. You are encouraged to choose additional Economics electives (you may take no more than 60 cu in Economics).
5. A course in calculus (Math 110 recommended) is a prerequisite for most 300 and 400 level economics courses.
