

## DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH, PH.D. DISSERTATION PROPOSAL FORM

A Ph.D. Dissertation in English is based upon original investigation. It must demonstrate mature scholarship and critical judgment on the part of the candidate, familiarity with tools and methods of research relevant to the topic and its objectives, and a clear and informed sense of the academic field to which the project of study makes a contribution. The length of the dissertation is typically between 200-400 words. The result is the basis for potential publication, whether in the form of articles, book chapters, or a monograph.

The Ph.D. Dissertation Proposal is to be developed with the Supervisor and members of the Advisory Committee. It is to be submitted to the Graduate Chair no later than 1 May of the second year of the Ph.D. degree. A Proposal Presentation will take place no later than 15 May, and the final version of the proposal—approved by the Advisory Committee as a whole—will be submitted along with this completed Ph.D. Dissertation Proposal form to the Graduate Chair for review by 31 May. The proposal typically comprises a 6-8 page overview of the research project and a 4-6 page bibliography.

Approval of the proposal does not bind the student to a given approach, nor does it cement the scope of the dissertation unyieldingly. The final organization, argument, and conclusions of the project are the Ph.D. Candidate's responsibility, in consultation with the Supervisor and the Advisory Committee. If the approved subject is abandoned, a new proposal must be submitted.
